

## 2 Thessalonians Context

(use this as a reference throughout the plan)

Always ask, "How does this point/relate back to the Gospel?" throughout everything you read. Author and setting are the same at 1 Thessalonians.

Background:

- Two decades after Jesus of Nazareth completed His earthly mission by means of His atoning death, victorious resurrection, and royal ascension.
- Paul is still on his second missionary journey in Corinth. (It lasted about 18 months)
- Perhaps the bearer of the first letter brought Paul back an update on the condition of the church, which had matured and expanded; but pressure and persecution had also increased
- Seeds of false doctrine concerning the Lord's return had been sown, and people's behavior was disorderly
- So, Paul wrote to his beloved flock who were:
  - 1. Discouraged by persecution and needed incentive to persevere (chapter 1)
  - 2. Deceived by false teachers who confused them about the Lord's return (eschatology) (chapter 2)
  - 3. Disobedient to divine commands, particularly refusing to work (chapter 3)
- Paul was intent on spotlighting Jesus' Lordship over human history and individual lives
- 2 Thess 1 Thanksgiving and comfort for the persecuted Thessalonians
- 2 Thess 2 Refuting the false claim about the day of the Lord
- 2 Thess 3 The problem of the idlers
