Galatians 6:14

Does pride ever stop you from restoring someone?

INTRODUCTION

- Do you find it difficult to open up and share your struggles with others?
- Does doing this ever make you feel like you're burdening other?

Galatians 6:1-6

- According to the scripture, how should we treat someone who is caught in a sin?
V2 tells us that we should carry each other's burdens. In order to help each other, we have to be willing to share with each other and be vulnerable.
- Are you someone who is willing to share your burden? What is holding you back? How do you know how much of your burden you should share? Who you should share with?
- Are you someone who is willing to help someone else carry their burden? Why/ why not?
- What does it look like to healthily carry another's burden with them?

Paul continues to tell the Galatian churches in v5 that "each one should carry their own load", which sounds strange after telling them to carry each other's burden. Paul is saying to not let pride get in the way of building each other up, each should examine their own heart first. We cannot go in a conversation thinking we could never fall into this sin, and we must acknowledge the sin in our own life. He is saying we need to take responsibility for your own sin and remember as we restore another we too get caught into sin. This will allow humility and grace to lead the conversation instead of pride and shame

Galatians 6:7-10

Do not be deceived...translate do not fool yourself or let the devil fool you when you are sowing desires of your flesh, flesh desires is what will be reaped, but also the opposite is true of the Spirit! But there is more work to sow in the Spirit because the flesh, the enemy, and the world are all contrary to it. That is why Paul tells them "do not become weary in doing good". The harvest, the end of the race, it will all be worth it in the end! This fight to combat sin, the enemy, and the world is a tough one and cannot be done alone. We need each other.

- How can we encourage each other daily to not become weary? (Rd Hebrews 3:13)
Often times there is a panic in the Christian of "where does God want me" but the question we should be asking is "what does God want me to do where I am". Paul says "as we have opportunity, let us do good to all people" vs10.
- Do you take opportunities to do good where you are at?

Galatians 6:11-18

- Are there any ways you are trying to hide behind the law in order to escape humiliation for the cross of Christ?
- What do you boast in? Why?
- What has been your biggest takeaway after finishing Galatians?
